## Lancers TAKE Virtual INCENTIVE TRIP



On April 13th Lancer Football players had a chance to get together and take a virtual field trip to the Pro Football Hall of Fame. The trip is part of Coach Lee's OffSeason Academic program. Thirty two players qualified for the trip! These players qualified because they did not receive a grade lower than a C on their 3rd grade report card.
Lancers had the opportunity to actually tune into a live webinar hosted by the Hall of Fame. Players were able to look at how the Hall of Fame tells the "Story of Pro Football" through its historical documents and priceless artifacts. During the visit players had a chance to interact with the presenter by submitting questions via a live chat function built into the software.
Incentive trips although now virtual will continue during the Pandemic. Updates and information on next months trip will be released soon.

## 2020 JV SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED



The 2020 Junior Varsity schedule has been completed. It includes a schedule of 9 games. Of those nine games, five of those game will be home at Lancer stadium.
The Lancers will have three non conference games to start the season. They open up the season
on August 29th at home against Mount Gilead. The following week the Lancers will travel to Berne Union. The last out of conference game will be at Home with West Muskingum.
The JV schedule will also include an away Buckeye crossover opponent Licking Valley on September 26th. After Utica on the
road, the season will end with four straight Cardinal games. It starts with a Home contest with Heath, on October 3rd and then the Lancers will travel to Northridge on October 10th.
The final two Home games of the season will be with Newark Catholic on October 17th \& Johnstown on October 24th.

## FORMER LANCER-NFLDRAFT PICK 1976



Gene Swick moved to Lakewood from Millersport his junior year. From 19701971 he started 20 games as the Lancers Quarterback. For his career he threw 301 times and completed 157 (52.1\%) for 2,253 yards, a LHS school record. During that time Lakewood went 17-3 under Coach Dou Grandstaff (1968-1973).

Gene Swick then would go on to a legendary career at the University of Toledo from 1972-1975. Gene Swick lettered three times as UT's starting quarterback and each season (1973-75) was first-team All-MAC. He was MAC "Back of the Year" in both 1974 and 1975. In 1975, he set the NCAA Division I record with 8,074 career yards, which broke the previous record held by Jim Plunkett of Stanford and stood until surpassed by Mark Herrmann of Purdue in 1980.

As a senior he became the first MAC quarterback ever honored as first team allAmerica by a major wire service (UPI). Following the 1975 season, he was named the nation's most outstanding quarterback by the Columbus Touchdown Club and was honored by Football Roundup Magazine as "Offensive Player of the Year." He played in the Senior Bowl Game and the East-West Shrine Game in San Francisco and finished 10th in balloting for the Heisman Trophy. The University of Toledo record for career passing yards was held by Swick (1972-2005), it was finally broken by Bruce Gradkowski in 2005.

Before the 1975 season, Swick had been considered a prospective first-round selection in the NFL Draft according to The Chicago Tribune. In the 1976 NFL Draft, Swick was selected in the fourth round, he was chosen with the 97th overall pick by the Cleveland Browns where he was later released. Swick remained the last Toledo quarterback drafted into the NFL until Tampa Bay picked Bruce Gradkowski in the sixth round of the 2006 NFL Draft.

In August of 1976 he attended tryouts with the New York Giants, and had a "twoyear, no-cut contract" with the Hamilton Tiger-Cats of the Canadian Football League.. However, Swick decided instead to retire and enter the business world. Swick is inducted into both the Lakewood High School Hall of Fame and the University of Toledo Hall of Fame.
