## RECRUIT NATION ELITE COMBINE TO BE HELD



**Lakewood High Schoo**l will be the site for the Central **Ohio Recruit Nation Elite Showcase** on **May 22nd!** The showcase will also provide a fundraiser opportunity for the football program and Lakewood Athletic Boosters!

The Showcase is offered to allow all athletes to showcase their skills and talents. By attending a Recruit Nation Elite Showcase,

athletes are able to ascend in the player ratings, building their regional and national profile. And finally, Recruit Nation works with the top recruiting service, Dream Scouting Network, which includes recruiting coordination, building exposure, and college connections. Recruit Nation has 150+ scouts that are dedicated to deliver to the public, full coverage of prospects throughout the country.

The Recruit Nation Showcase Series provides players with the ability to be evaluated by college coaches while at the same time being professionally filmed. These are extensive skills and drills showcases. Players will execute all of the individual skills that are featured at college prospect days. Additionally, scouts from the Dream Scouting Network will be on hand to evaluate each player. They will also send your recruiting information to each college program in your region. The colleges will receive the player's "Athlete Spotlight" (demographics, academic profile, stats, and film). There will also be a **Recruit Nation Junior** run after the high school event.

The Recruit Nation Elite Showcase Series provides players with the ability to be evaluated by the Dream All-American Bowl committee & college coaches. These are extensive skills and drills showcases. ## PRESIDENTS WHO PLAYED FOOTBALL



With the Presidents Day Holiday occurring in the month of February, we thought we would take a look at those Presidents who not only led our country but also played football. Here are the six presidents that did both!

**Donald Trump (New York Military Academy):** Trump was a three sport athlete at New York Military Academy and played on the football team for one year.

John F. Kennedy (Harvard): Kennedy wasn't the only member of his family to play football at Harvard, as both Robert and Edward Kennedy did as well. Unlike his brothers, though, John never really played. In fact, JFK never made it past the JV thanks to illness and injuries.

Richard Nixon (Whittier College): Like Kennedy, Nixon never really played at Whittier College in California, but at least he was on the team. He just served as a reserve tackle. Now, think about that for a moment. I know Whittier isn't exactly an SEC school, but Richard Nixon, who was 5-foot-11 and weighed 175 pounds, played tackle. Most kickers are bigger than that nowadays.

Ronald Reagan (Eureka College): Reagan played at tiny Eureka College in Illinois, but he wasn't exactly a revelation on the field.

He was a lineman at Eureka College in Illinois, but his more well-known football connection is for portraying Notre Dame football great George Gipp in the 1940 film Knute Rockne, All American, Without him, how would we have known to win one for the Gipper?

**Dwight D. Eisenhower (Army)**: Before he went on to his military career, and then the Presidency, lke served as both a running back and linebacker at Army, starting on both sides of the ball. He also tackled Jim Thorpe once, which is a greater football accomplishment than any of the first three Presidents on this list can even dream of.

Gerald Ford (Michigan): Not only did Ford play at Michigan, but was a team MVP with the Wolverines after being named all-state in high school. He also had offers to go pro following college, but instead chose to coach at Yale while attending law school there. Then he ended up as President, which probably doesn't happen if he signs with the Green Bay Packers instead Gerald Ford was all-state at South High School in Grand Rapids, MI, and went on to become an MVP for the University of Michigan (even playing against the Chicago Bears as a member of the 1935 collegiate all-star team).


